LETTER FROM THE CHAIRWOMAN OF THE BOARD

s an economist, I have always seen numbers as a way of understanding reality – and one of the harshest realities we see today is the hunger one. Despite recent advances in Brazil, such as the improvement in food security indicators, the truth is that we still have a long way to go. Around 8.7 million Brazilians faced severe food insecurity in 2023 according to the latest edition of the Pesquisa Nacional por Amostra de Domicílios (Pnad Contínua, a national household sample survey). This means that these people went a whole day without eating in at least one occasion.

The contrast is even more alarming when we consider that, at the same time, we waste 55 million tons of food per year. It's a painful paradox: an empty plate on one side and food going to trash bins on the other. In addition to the economic losses, estimated at more than 1 trillion dollars globally, food waste contributes up to 10% of greenhouse gas emissions. These figures reveal a systemic problem that demands also a systemic response.

This urgency is one of the reasons that has made Pacto Contra a Fome established itself as an ecosystem catalyst: an organization that brings together a diversity of actors, connects solutions and facilitates the development of self-sustainable responses to the hunger issue. We work in collaboration with governments, companies, academia, universities, civil society organizations, churches, the press and citizens, forming dynamic networks that can strength local initiatives and long-term public policies.

MESSAGE FROM THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS

razil has faced increasingly complex challenges related to hunger, food insecurity and food waste in recent years. The consistent increase in prices of basic food items puts pressure on vulnerable families' budget, making it difficult for them to have regular and sufficient access to food. This scenario is driven by a combination of factors: supply shocks, logistical failures and extreme weather events that affect food production and distribution – such as droughts and floods.

At the same time, the country copes with high levels of waste throughout the food production chain, from harvest to final consumption, exacerbating the mismatch between supply and access. These elements combined contribute to Brazil still figuring on the UN Hunger Map, highlighting the persistence of serious food insecurity. This is the scenario that Pacto Contra a Fome operates: with its feet in the country's reality, its eyes wide opened to the global context and its commitment to building effective responses to guarantee food on the plate and dignity at the table.

Throughout 2024, we have lots of challenges, achievements and lessons learned. We ended the cycle with 17 ongoing projects in six states: Ceará, Maranhão, Minas Gerais, Pará, Paraná and São Paulo. Each of these initiatives was built in partnership with governments, civil society organizations, companies and academia. It is this combination of efforts that multiplies our impact, which is also a reflection of the hard work of our team.

That's why we're very proud to highlight the growth of our in-house team, made up of professionals with high technical qualifications and sensitivity. These is the people behind the various milestones achieved along this road – among them, the contribution of Pacto Contra a Fome to the regulation of the Brazilian Tax Reform, which guaranteed tax exemption on healthy food.

This achievement was the result of intense work with various members of parliament: we produced technical notes, presented proposals and actively participated in the discussions that culminated in a healthier and more regionalized National Basic Food Basket. A fundamental measure to ensure that fiscal policy contributes to fairer and more accessible food.

We continued to build bridges between politics and the fight against hunger in the municipal elections. We drew up a document with proposals for public policies and good practices to combat hunger and food waste. The endorsement of candidates in six capitals – Belém, Campo Grande, Fortaleza, Recife, São Luís and São Paulo – symbolized a public commitment to the food security agenda and guided voters to choose representatives committed to the issue.

We also expanded our presence in international spaces, participating in G20 and in the dialogues that resulted in the creation of the Global Alliance against Hunger and Poverty. Under the Brazilian presidency, the group put the fight against hunger at the center of the geopolitical agenda. Participating in this construction reinforced our conviction that Brazil can – and must – lead the way in the global fight against hunger.

On this journey, we are also celebrating stories and mobilizing new voices. The second edition of Pacto Contra a Fome Award received more than 500 entries, an increase of 65% on the previous year. By awarding six organizations that act in an exemplary way in its territories, we recognize powerful initiatives that transform realities every day. The "Comida boa é na boca, e não na boca do lixo" (good food is in your mouth, not in the garbage can) campaign had an impact on more than 20 million people, mobilized celebrities such as gymnast Rebeca Andrade and occupied highly visible spaces – from the uniform of a soccer club to TV stations – generating a public debate about waste as social injustice.

None of this would have been possible without our many fellows: our institutional partners, donors, councils, local coordinators and technical staff. The journey is collective, which is why we continue side by side, sewing alliances, connecting solutions and opening new routes to make a structural and long-term transformation of the reality of hunger in Brazil.






In 2024, we made progress in structuring Pacto Contra a Fome's governance and team, in line with the growth of our activities. Institutional governance now has three main bodies: the Executive Committee, the Executive Board and the Management Forum – complementary spaces for decision-making, setting guidelines and integration between areas. These bodies help to guarantee the organization's strategic alignment, risk analysis and operational coherence. It is important to note that the strategic guidelines come from the Advisory Council, a permanent body that guides the construction of Pacto Contra a Fome's governance vision.

Some of the eight technical and administrative areas that form Management Forum grew and gained organizational strength throughout the year, with new professionals, more structured processes and well-defined goals. A milestone in this process was the creation of the People & Institutional Management area in June, dedicated to take care of the people and strengthening the organizational culture.

This internal structuring process went hand in hand with the expansion of the team, which grew throughout 2024 – a reflection of our commitment to build a solid, efficient organization that is prepared to drive lasting transformations in food safety in Brazil.

In 2024, the project consolidated itself as one of the main fronts of technical support and articulation in strengthening the Food and Nutrition Security agenda in the state. The signing of a Technical Cooperation Agreement with the Ceará government marked the beginning of a structuring action, focused on improving the effectiveness of public policies through evidence and multisectoral mobilization. Pacto Contra a Fome reinforced with this its role as a strategic ally in the formulation and implementation of solutions to combat hunger in the territory.

One of the highlights of the year was the production of a study on the municipalities in Ceará most exposed to food and nutritional insecurity. in partnership with Observatório da Indústria from FIEC. The material was presented to the State Food and Nutrition Security Council (Consea), the vice-governor's office, the Ceará State Economic Research and Strategy Institute (Ipece), the Social Protection Secretariat (SPS), and 30 other multisector leaders, fostering a space for dialogue between leaders from the public, private, third and academic sectors.

In December, we participated in the first meeting of the Ceará Sem Fome agreement, an initiative that demonstrates the importance of joint and collaborative action to solve complex problems.

The project focuses on giving technical support for the implementation of the Sistema Nacional de Segurança Alimentar e Nutricional - Sisan (National Food and Nutrition Security System) in Maranhão and Pará adapting strategies to each state. The goal is to consolidate more efficient public policies, expand local governance, and structure actions capable of guaranteeing the right to adequate food for more people.

We began 2024 with an institutional presentation of the project and the formalization of Technical Cooperation Agreements with state governments — a relevant milestone, especially in the field of the third sector. We then carried out a comprehensive diagnosis of the SAN systems in both territories. This study was carried out in partnership with Falconi Consultori and served as a basis for guiding the future strategies of each territory, according to their realities and priorities.

In the second half of the year, the states moved forward on their own – but complementary – paths. In **Pará**, the diagnosis contributed directly to the formulation of the Pará Sem Fome policy and the new State SAN Plan (2025–2028).



The aim of this project is to contribute to the construction of a national food redistribution policy, strengthening the donation system in Brazil, expanding access to food and reducing the environmental impacts of losses and waste. The initiative is based on the understanding that clearer and more efficient legal frameworks are essential to promote structural solutions in the fight against hunger.

In 2024, we make progresses in the elaboration of proposals and in the analysis of the legal and political scenario, with the support of a specialized consultancy. The work involved in-depth studies, a survey about international experiences and the definition of the premises that will guide our actions in 2025. In this process, we mobilized the Ministry of Agrarian Development and Family Farming, state governments and the National Congress, in a strategic articulation with different levels of government.

Following the success of the "Com Fome, Não Dá" (It is impossible with hunger) campaign, in 2023, we launched a new one entitled "Comida Boa é na Boca, Não na Boca do Lixo" (Good Food is in the Mouth, not in the Garbage Can) — once again conceived and implemented thanks to our partnership with Africa Creatives. With accessible language, strong visual appeal and distribution across multiple channels, the campaign was structured in phases and adapted to different audiences — from producers and retailers to consumers.

In early September, the film was broadcasted in the commercial breaks of Jornal Nacional. We also gained visibility on 427 radio stations and on the country's main news outlets, such as Valor Econômico, Band and CNN Brasil.

The campaign also gained prominence in other spaces, such as shopping malls owned by the Multiplan, Iquatemi and Syn chains, Brasília Airport, cinemas and football stadiums — with the participation of São Paulo FC and support from Olympic gymnast Rebeca Andrade, expanding even more the reach of the message.

In addition to the mass campaign to raise awareness about the problem of waste, we created support material with practical guidelines. The guide "Lugar de Comida é no Prato" (food must be in the plate) brings together accessible tips on how to reduce food waste in your daily life and was downloaded more than a thousand times shortly after its launch, expanding the educational impact of the campaign.

As a result, we recorded more than 250 million views on television, radio, digital platforms and out-of-home media, consolidating the campaign as the largest communication campaign in the history of the Pacto Contra a Fome. Engagement was also very positive — more than 100 thousand interactions with campaign content and around 1 million people reached via influencer posts — with the participation of 55 public figures and an organic presence on multiple platforms. The campaign expanded its scope beyond digital and TV, with a national physical presence and strategic partnerships with brands, media outlets and institutions, highlighting the cause's mobilization power and the Pacto's positioning in the public debate on food waste.

The Supply Centers occupy a strategic place in the food production chain, connecting production and retail, especially of fruits, vegetables and greens — essential ingredients for food security. They are also places with a high volume of waste, which makes their role central in the fight against hunger.

For this reason, we developed a project with the objective of strengthening and modernizing the redistribution of food through the Food Banks located in the Ceasas. Started in 2024, the action involved technical visits to the units in São Paulo (Ceagesp), Belo Horizonte (Ceasa Minas) and Curitiba (Ceasa Paraná), and coordinated actions with the government of Ceará. We were able to map good practices, begin the development of replicable models and conduct an in-depth study on the use of food in Ceasas — which supported proposals for logistics improvements.

The signing of an agreement with the Ministry of Agrarian Development and Family Farming (MDA) marked the formalization of the partnership and paved the way for national expansion.

The National Basic Food Basket project, which began in 2023, has established itself as one of the main political advocacy fronts of the Pacto Contra a Fome. That year, we worked on developing guidelines for the composition of the new basket, based on scientific evidence on the social, economic, and nutritional benefits of a healthy, regionalized, and tax-free diet. We produced a Technical Note in partnership with other civil society organizations, coordinated with members of congressman, and participated in debates in the National Congress, which resulted in the proposal being incorporated into the final text of the Tax Reform approved in December 2023.

In 2024, the project entered a new phase, focusing on detailing the list of products and applicable tax rates. To contribute to advance in this discussion, we delivered a new Technical Note to the Ministry of Finance — prepared with Ação da Cidadania —, which became a reference in the development of the new basket. The document advocated total tax exemption for natural or minimally processed foods and partial exemption for nutritionally relevant items such as oilseeds.



Throughout the year, we participated in public hearings, filed amendments and maintained technical and political dialogue with several members of parliament. In December 2024 we celebrated the approval of the new National Basic Food Basket, composed essentially of healthier and minimally processed foods, with guaranteed tax exemption. This achievement represents a historic advance and reinforces Pacto's ability to transform technical knowledge and multisectoral coordination into concrete public policies.

The project has the common goal of promoting the integration of people in vulnerable situations into the job market and productive activities with simultaneous fronts in Ceará and São Paulo. The proposal seeks to strengthen financial autonomy paths, contributing to overcoming poverty and improving families' living conditions. The work is based on local diagnoses and the construction of customized solutions for each territory, in partnership with the government, civil society and companies.

In Ceará, we produced a report on the local scenario of food insecurity and productive inclusion then we formulated strategic guidelines to quide state public policies. The proposal was validated by the Productive Inclusion Coordination of the Social Protection Secretariat, which invited Pacto Contra a Fome to join the technical group responsible for defining professional qualification strategies for 2025. This formal recognition marks an important step in the institutionalization of our work in the state.



As a result of the campaign, 13 candidates for mayor and city councilor publicly signed the Agenda — most of them in capitals or cities of political relevance, such as São Paulo (SP), Campo Grande (MS) and Teresópolis (RJ). Through the "Seu Voto Alimenta" (your vote can feed) campaign, we also sought to raise awareness among the population about the importance of municipal elections in the construction of effective public policies to guarantee the right to food. In 2025, we will continue to monitor the commitments made and expand the scope of this mobilization.






A central tool in our articulation strategy, the Connections Hub is an instrument that drives collaboration between organizations, initiatives and people engaged in the fight against hunger and food waste. In 2024, the project underwent a **major technical overhaul**, with improvements to the registration flow, which made it more accessible and efficient for those working in the field.

This evolution allowed the Hub to become a key part of our other actions such as the Pacto Contra a Fome Award 2024 by enabling a more structured process for registration, screening and automated classification of participating initiatives.

The platform was also essential for political mobilization during the municipal elections, facilitating the collection of electronic signatures from candidates committed to our Agenda to Combat Hunger, Loss and Waste in Municipalities.



One of our most recent projects, the Observatório da Fome (Hunger Observatory) plays a fundamental role in generating intelligence to address food insecurity in Brazil. The digital platform will gather and interpret public data on hunger, poverty, and food waste, offering an integrated and updated view of the problem on a national scale. By transforming data into evidence, we can support the formulation of more effective public policies and the coordinated action of different sectors.

Over the past year, we have been able to advance in the stages of exploratory research, structuring the database, and developing an initial visualization model in Power BI — a tool that transforms data into graphs, reports, and interactive dashboards to facilitate analysis and decision-making. We have conducted territorial analyses with municipal data from Ceará, Maranhão, and Pará, in addition to building a minimum viable version (MVP) of the platform, which lays the foundations for its consolidation in the next cycles.



The second edition of the Pacto Contra a Fome Award reaffirmed the importance of recognizing those on the front lines of the fight against hunger and food waste in Brazil. Held in cooperation with four United Nations agencies — the Food and Agriculture Organization of the United Nations (FAO); the United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization (UNESCO); the United Nations Environment Programme (UNEP); and the World Food Programme (WFP) — the award strengthened the visibility of solutions that act directly in the most vulnerable territories, addressing complex challenges and promoting concrete transformations in the lives of thousands of people.

Initiatives from the five regions of the country were awarded in two categories: food loss and waste and promotion of food security. Each of the six winners received R\$100,000, financial mentoring, legal advice and a trophy signed by the artist Vik Muniz. More than financial recognition, the award has the symbolic role of shedding light on experiences that are often invisible, giving voice and a platform to those who transform realities with creativity, resilience and courage.

Compared to the previous edition, **we have a significant growth in 2024**. The number of entries jumped from 310 to 512 — an increase of 65% —, with applications coming from all 27 Brazilian states. Gender representation was also a highlight: 55% of the initiatives were led by women. More than 400 people attended the awards ceremony, including representatives from the government, private sector, academia, and civil society.

In addition to the physical presence, the online and media coverage consolidated the award as an important engagement tool.

More than 10 million people were impacted in the press, and we recorded a 56% increase in reach and 12% in interactions on Instagram compared to 2023. The estimated return of R\$3.5 million in spontaneous media reflected not only public interest in the topic, but also the credibility of Pacto as an articulator of structural solutions.

None of this would be possible without the support of the sponsors who made the initiative possible. We would like to express our gratitude to the partner institutions that made this edition of the award possible and contributed to expanding its reach and impact.





In response to the public calamity in Rio Grande do Sul, Pacto Contra a Fome helped structure a project to recover family farming through an innovative operation of Agribusiness Receivables Certificate (CRA). With a total value of R\$10 million, the initiative aims to restore the productive capacity of around a thousand farming families linked to the Movimento dos Pequenos Agricultores Small Farmers Movement (MPA), promoting access to microcredit and ensuring the resumption of planting, grazing and production activities on properties of up to 50 hectares.

In 2024, the full fundraising was completed and the first transfer of R\$2 million was made to three agricultural cooperatives, benefiting around 200 families. The operation was designed not to compromise the financial sustainability of the cooperatives involved, with a repayment term of ten years and a grace period of three. The project reaffirms the role of the Pacto Contra a Fome as an articulator of emergency and structuring solutions, integrating humanitarian response and strengthening resilience in the territories most affected by extreme climate events.

The project aims to combat hunger and promote food security in the Jardim Julieta community, in the northern part of São Paulo, through the daily distribution of free, healthy meals. The initiative is managed by the Capim Santo Institute and has our technical and institutional support.

More than ensuring immediate access to nutritious food, the initiative seeks to work on professional qualifications and productive inclusion, contributing to the autonomy of residents in vulnerable situations. We invested in structuring the community kitchen and in the logistical preparation of the operation in 2024. The infrastructure of the space was completed, allowing the production of meals aligned with Guia Alimentar para a População Brasileira (Food Guide for the Brazilian Population) and the full use of food.

The mapping and registration of 860 families in the region was also carried out, an essential step to ensure that distribution is done with a focus on those who need it most. Throughout the process, we at the Pacto Contra a Fome continued to mobilize resources for the operational stage, scheduled to begin in 2025.








